Brief Background of the Hymn

This hymn written by Watchman Nee shows a strong burden brother Nee had in his resumed ministry after 1948: the breaking of outer man and the release of the spirit.

"He frequently shared that though the Holy Spirit dwells in our spirit, if our outer man is not broken, our spirit could never be released. The Holy Spirit dwelling in our spirit is confined and imprisoned by the outer man. For this reason the outer man must be broken that the inner man (the human spirit with the Holy Spirit) might be released. The scriptural basis for this reality is 2 Corinthians 4:16, "Though our outer man is decaying, yet our inner man is being renewed day by day." ("Watchman Nee—A Seer of the Divine Revelation in the Present Age" by Witness Lee, Ch. 16)

In John 12:24 the Lord Jesus said, "Unless the grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it abides alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." Life is in the grain. However, there is a shell outside of the grain, a very powerful shell. As long as this shell does not break open, the grain cannot grow. ...Therefore, it is not a matter of whether or not the grain has life, but whether the outer shell is broken. The very next verse says, "He who loves his soul-life loses it; and he who hates his soul-life in this world shall keep it unto eternal life" (v. 25). According to the Lord the outer shell is our own life, and the inner life is the eternal life that He dispenses. In order for the inner life to be released, the outer life must suffer loss. If that which is outward is not broken, that which is inward cannot be released ("The Breaking of the Outer Man and the Belease of the Spirit" by Watchman Nee Chapter 1

"In order for our outer man to be broken, we need to consecrate ourselves to the Lord. Consecration, ...is only an expression of our intention to willingly give ourselves unconditionally, unreservedly, and unequivocally to God. ...After consecration there is still the need of discipline from the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit does not deal with our outer man by strengthening our inner man. ...This does not mean that the inner man does not need to be strengthened. It means that God has a different way of dealing with the outer man. ...It is hard for the inner man to bruise or crush the outer man. The nature of the outer man corresponds to the nature of outward things; the outer man is easily affected by the outward things. The outward things can crush inflict nain and bruise the outer man much better than the inner man can. Therefore, God deals with our outer man with outward things." ("The Breaking of the Outer Man and the Release of the Spirit" by Watchman Nee, Chapter 6)
