Let me love and not be requited

Let me love and not be requited.

Let me serve and not be rewarded.

Let me labor and not be remembered.

Brief Background of the Hymn

Watchman Nee (1903-1972) was "a unique gift to this age..., was given by the Lord to His Body for His move of recovery on the earth" (*Watchman Nee—A Seer of the Divine Revelation in the Present Age, Ch. 1*). He was "a seer of the divine revelation in the present age".

Brother Nee did not write many hymns, but what he wrote were all with high quality. When he came to compose a hymn, he was very careful on the truth and structure of the hymn, making sure the hymn did convey spiritual reality. In Brother Nee's whole life, he edited and published two hymnal books (in Chinese, displayed in our lobby) for the Lord's Recovery. The first "Hymnal", which included 184 hymns, was published in 1932 in Shanghai, China. Among these 184 hymns, a small part were written by Brother Nee. The rest were translated, improved, and adjusted by him from over 10,000 hymns, poems, and songs. (All 184 hymns are listed in "Collected Works of Watchman Nee, Vol. 23: The Song of Songs & Hymns") This hymnal had been used until 1952.

The second "Hymnal" had 1052 hymns, including 146 hymns written by Witness Lee before 1950. Brother Nee started to work on it in 1948 with the help of several co-workers. After finishing editing work, brother Nee said: "Lord, I thank you! This maybe the last service I could offer to the church!" This hymnal was published in June, 1952 and used until 1958. Brother Nee was arrested on April 10, 1952 and went to be with the Lord on May 31, 1972. The majority of the hymns included in our current version of "Hymnal" are from this hymnal.

"Let me love and not be requited" was a poem Brother Nee wrote in 1930 (Hymn No. 185 in "Collected Works of Watchman Nee, Vol. 23: The Song of Songs & Hymns"). From the beginning to the line "Suffer loss that I might a pilgrim's life live out" was a prayer made by a Italian brother, St. Francis of Assisi (1182-1226). Brother Nee added the rest when he was translating this poem. In 1976, Sister Mimi Lam (1947-2001) composed music for this hymn. For the past three decades, this hymn has been one of the most loved hymns among Christians everywhere.

In his whole life, Brother Nee followed the Lord and walked on the way of the cross faithfully and absolutely. This hymn very much reflects his living and his attitude of "asking nothing for himself, but asking everything for the Lord". May we all be encouraged by our brother being such a pattern to us, walking faithfully and steadfastly on the way of life and the way of the cross for the building of the Body of Christ.
